# VULCANUS IN JAPAN

## WHAT IS IT?

The programme consists of industrial placements for EU students. It starts in September and ends in August of the following year in order to accommodate the academic year in EU Member States.

The whole programme takes place in Japan. The students follow:

- 1- a seminar on "Japan";
- 2- a 4-month intensive Japanese language course;
- 3- an 8-month traineeship in a Japanese company.

VULCANUS IN JAPAN started in 1997.

## ARE YOU ELIGIBLE?

Applicants must be:

- 1/ EU nationals;
- 2/ engineering or science students (°);
- 3/ at the time of application, applicants must be registered at an EU University on an undergraduate or postgraduate course;
- 4/ they must be able to take a year out.

(°) *Computer science, science engineering, mechanical engineering, chemical, electronics, biotechnology, electrical engineering, physics, telecommunication, nuclear engineering, civil engineering, metal materials, ceramics, production system, architecture, etc.*

## OBJECTIVES

To study the range of advanced technologies employed by a leading Japanese host company, to learn Japanese and to understand and appreciate Japanese culture with a view to an enriching one year experience abroad, to be well placed in your future career to interact with Japanese businesses and people.

## WHO PAYS WHAT?

This programme is financed by the EU-Japan Centre for Industrial Cooperation (a joint venture co-financed by the European Commission and the Japanese Ministry of Economy, Trade & Industry), and the Japanese host company.

The European students are awarded a grant of 2.000.000 yen to cover the cost of travel to and from Japan and living expenses in Japan. There is no charge for the language course and seminar, and accommodation is provided free of charge during the language course and the company traineeship.

## SELECTION CRITERIA

Applicants are selected on the basis of their academic record and the opinion of their tutors, their knowledge of written and spoken English, their motivation, their attitude to EU-Japan relations and their ability to adapt to a different culture.

14	Q	<b>Will there be a preparatory meeting in Brussels?</b>
	A	Yes. In July (1 day), prior to your departure for Japan. This meeting is compulsory (note that the travel expenses and accommodation will be covered by our Centre).
15	Q	<b>When will I receive the grant? Is it enough to live in Japan?</b>
	A	The grant (2.000.000 yen) is split in 3 parts. You will receive the first part at the start of the programme, the second in December 2010, the third in April 2011. Previous Vulcanus students have found the grant sufficient to live on (enjoying a student lifestyle). Should you wish to undertake expensive activities (trips etc.), you will need to pay for them yourself.
16	Q	<b>Who will purchase my ticket for Japan?</b>
	A	You will have to buy your own return air ticket. Under Japanese immigration rules all Vulcanus trainees must enter Japan on the same day. By e-mail, we will instruct you which day this will be.
17	Q	<b>Until when can I <u>withdraw</u> from the programme without damaging the Centre?</b>
	A	This is a <b>delicate issue</b> : in Japan there is no proper culture of traineeships, and once a file of a student has been sent to the Company, it is very difficult for the Company, culturally speaking, to understand and accept the withdrawal of the student. Should a student withdraw after the beginning of March, it is very probable that the good relations between the Company and the Centre will be interrupted and that the Company will not apply again. This can cause substantial damage to the Centre's reputation and major problems in finding and retaining prestigious host companies. This is why we ask you to be aware of this issue, when you apply. Any withdrawal after the <b>beginning of March 2010</b> (the start of match-making) would cause big problems for the Centre. Please consider this issue and be certain of your intentions and very strong motivation, before applying (also see clause <b>i-6</b> on this point in the application form).
18	Q	<b>* I will graduate in September (or similar); can I start the programme later? * I am looking for a traineeship of a shorter length (i.e. 5 months), could you provide one? * A traineeship has been offered to me by a Japanese company for 7 months, could I receive a Vulcanus grant?</b>
	A	These and other similar scenarios are not possible. All participants must start the programme together (they must arrive the same day in Japan and, one year later, leave the same day from Japan – <b>These dates have to be announced by the Centre</b> ). The Vulcanus scheme is not flexible; participants must attend all its parts. Grants are offered exclusively to official Vulcanus participants.
19	Q	<b>If I apply with some friends, will it be possible to obtain placements in the same city?</b>
	A	Match-makings are individual. Should you apply, you must be prepared to be the only short-listed applicant among your group of friends.
20	Q	<b>Will my accommodation include a private bathroom, kitchen, etc.? What furniture will there be in the room?</b>
	A	This depends upon the Host Company. This information will be provided to us by the Company before your departure for Japan.
21	Q	<b>May my partner or spouse spend some time/the whole year with me in Japan? Can you provide assistance for his/her visa, accommodation, etc?</b>
	A	If you decide to apply, please fully understand and accept the following: a/ Vulcanus <b>cannot</b> assist your partner/spouse in obtaining a visa for Japan. Should you wish to take your partner/spouse to Japan, please be fully aware of the difficulties to obtain a visa for him/her, and apply to the programme <b>ONLY</b> if you are prepared to take part even if he/she will not obtain a visa. b/ Through Vulcanus you are offered strictly personal accommodation in a company dormitory, where you are not allowed to host guests, whoever they be. # VULCANUS IN JAPAN

## **WHAT IS IT?**

The programme consists of industrial placements for EU students. It starts in September and ends in August of the following year in order to accommodate the academic year in EU Member States.

The whole programme takes place in Japan.

The students follow:

- 1- a seminar on "Japan";
  - 2- a 4-month intensive Japanese language course;
  - 3- an 8-month traineeship in a Japanese company.

Applicants must be:
